



CATTLE ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE TIMES

- Beef Cattle must be at the show ground by 12:00 pm on Wednesday.
- Cattle may be removed from the showgrounds after release of winner's prizes approx. 3:00pm Saturday. Cattle removed prior to this time without authorisation from Chief Steward will forfeit any prizes won during the show.

CATTLE REGISTRATIONS/OWNERSHIP/BREED STANDARD

- All exhibits must be herd book registered correctly with their breed society. Any exhibit that is not will be ineligible to compete in classes.
- All jointly owned entries may only be exhibited under the combined joint ownership as per society registration status.
- Handlers (ALL) are expected to wear relevant Breed Society Uniform or white dust coat when exhibiting cattle for competition (Exception – Young Beef Handlers Schools Competition – School Uniforms may be worn)
- Animals to be judged according to Breed Standard.
- · Please take care when filling in entry forms that information entered is correct and aligns with what is noted on your breed society registration papers.
- Substitution of cattle must be made in writing and be in the Chief Beef Cattle Stewards hands 14 days prior to the first day of the show.
- Inspections of cattle will be coordinated with representatives of the breed society if required.



OH&S REQUIREMENT

- Any person who is staying on the grounds overnight must sign the register at the Beef Cattle Committee Office before 4pm each day. Junior Handlers must be signed in by an adult.
- To ensure compliance with Fire Brigade regulations, no flame of any description is permitted in livestock pavilions.

CATTLE HEALTH - Deloraine Vet Clinic

- Any animal found infected with ringworm prior to arriving at the Showgrounds must be accompanied
 by a veterinary certificate stating that the veterinarian has seen the animal treated in the last four
 days with an appropriate fungicide. If the infection is deemed to be so bad and/or unsightly that the
 showing of that animal is likely to detract from the spectacle of the Show, the animal may be deemed
 ineligible for competition at the discretion of the Chief Steward and by recommendation of the
 Veterinarian.
- All cattle must be tied up with strong halters and neck straps. NO CHAINED NECK STRAPS ARE ALLOWED.
- Exhibitors will need to provide JBAS Number and PIC on entry form as all cattle will need to be NLIS scanned on arrival to the Royal Launceston Show.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Ages and sex of calves on cows and heifers must be shown on entry form.
- All animals entered in the Beef Cattle Section must be registered in a recognised Australian Herd Book of their breed. Animals entered in the Led Steer/Heifer Competition are exempt.
- Clipping and washing frames may be used at the Show on sites designated by the Cattle Committee.
- All handlers must have stock ready for parades on time. When parading for the judge or in the parade, animals over 9 months must be equipped with nose rings/nose clips and leads.
- Any bull over the age of 9 months must have a permanent nose ring.
- No vehicles to be permitted inside the cattle shed during show days (including early AM/late PM).
 Please be considerate of other exhibitors and remove your vehicle as soon as possible after unloading/loading.
- Ensure that you enter the judging ring in catalogue order or as specified by the ring steward.
- Only one handler in the judging ring per animal at any one time.
- The Beef Cattle Stewards may, if they deem it necessary, alter judging order and/or times.
- All exhibitors are to supply their own washing hose with ¾ inch fittings.
- All entries are accepted subject to the 'Rules and Regulations' of the society. Rules available on request.

ONSITE CAMPING

- On site camping will be available and there is plenty of room for Caravans, tents, and swags. There is limited power close and handy.
- Space for camping is required to be nominated for on your entry form.

CATTLE BEDDING

- Wood shavings only being used for Beef Cattle bedding. Cost will be \$15 per head for the shavings. If you need to contact Chief Cattle Steward Luke Bonar to discuss, contact number 0408 556 355.
- Excessive use of shavings will attract a penalty fee.
- Could all exhibitors please make sure they have access to a wheelbarrow and stable fork to assist with the cleaning of the shed.
- All bedding to be cleaned out prior to 8:30am each morning of the show.

Sawdust Bedding for Cattle - Principles for Good Management

To achieve the best results from bedding cattle on sawdust, the following system of management is recommended:

- a) Pick up manure at every opportunity.
 - b) Avoid water spillage in stalls.
- c) Regularly smooth out the bed with the aim of assisting drying.
 - d) Consider using rubber matting for front half of bed.
 - e) Do not dig out the wet patches.
 - f) Do not disturb the bedding base.
 - g) Keep the top of the bed loose.

Experience has shown that properly managed bedding will last a full Show with little need for top up bedding, particularly with some classes of livestock.

- Under the FCAS Rules and Regulations competitors must be over 15 and under 25yrs of age at the 1st of May to be eligible to represent at state finals.
- State Final of the Champion Young Judges is to be judged at Scottsdale Show 17-18th November 2023.

CALF CLASSIC

- Open to all Beef Calves. Calves to be judged in 3 classes with placings for each.
- Entry fee is \$10 PER CALF (NOT PER CLASS)
- Calf Class 1: To be judged per beef cattle judging guidelines in accordance with breed standard. Calf Class 2: Best handled/Cared for Calf Handler to be no older than 14 years of age.

LED STEER/HEIFER COMPETITION

- To be held on Saturday with classes.
- Steers/Heifers will be weighed on Wednesday when bulls are weighed.
- Steers and Heifers will be judged on their ability to meet specifications for their nominated harvest date.

These classes will require entries of 6 or more to go ahead. Refunds will be given to those exhibitors who enter this class, if the class then doesn't proceed.

- Entry Fee \$15.00
- To be held Thursday afternoon.
- Eligible for anyone over the age of 13yrs.
- Entrants must have access to a clipping chute for the time of the competition.
- Animals are to be exhibited in their general beef breed classes or in the steer/heifer class.
- Animals should be free of product at the beginning of the class.
- Competitors will have 20 minutes, with warnings at the 10 & 5 mins remaining to have their animal ready for final inspection. Any animal not ready by the end of time will not be eligible to be judged in the final inspection.

Participants will be judged on how they prepare and present the animal for showing.

Once prepared for parading all animals must be led with a leather show halter for final inspection.

Competitors will be required to provide the following:

Clipping Chute

Nominated animal.

Rope Halter & Nose Lead to secure animal to designated tie up area.

Preparation equipment (Loose items in a bucket) - Blowers, brushes, sprays etc

Show Halter and Cane

ENTRIES

- Entry Fee \$7.50 per handler
- Entries are due in at the same time as the Beef Cattle Entry Form

PARADERS CLASSES

- Classes to be arranged on age of participants as of 1 MAY 2023 As per the Agricultural Show Council of Tasmania Guidelines
- Class age groups to be: 9-12yrs, 13-14yrs, 15-16yrs, 17-19yrs, 20-under 25yrs,
- There will be a Junior Champion Handler judged from the winner of classes 9-12yrs, 13-14yrs, 15-16yrs and a Senior Champion Handler from the 17-19yrs and 20-under 25yrs classes.
- An overall Grand Champion Hander will be judged from the winner of the Junior and Senior Champion Handler Class

POINTS TO BE AWARDED FOR

- 1. Grooming technique and presentation of animal
- 2. Personal grooming and attire of the handler
- 3. Approach to and knowledge of animal
- 4. Total preparation of animal from first thing in the morning of competition
- 5. Ability of handler to lead and present the animal.

NOVICE PARADER - ALL AGE GROUPS

To qualify for this award a novice handler must have never been placed at a show in either beef or dairy handlers age group final.

YOUNG PARADERS SCHOOL TEAM

- Three handlers to represent their school irrespective of breed of cattle and age of handler.
- Handlers must participate in Young Beef Paraders Classes to be eligible to compete in this event.
- Note: Champion Young Beef Paraders and Grand Champion Paraders Group are to be judged whilst the school Teams remain on the parade ground

State Final Champion Paraders is to be Judged at Circular Head Show, Saturday 2nd December 2023.

Under the FCAS Rules and Regulations competitors must be over 15 and under 25yrs of age at the 1st of May to be eligible to represent at state finals.

NOTES TO BEEF YOUNG PARADERS:

- Handlers may use a steer or heifer and for entrants in the senior classes (Class 23/24) may choose to use a junior bull.
- All cattle must be born in the previous year from March 1st onwards.
- · Handlers must wear either school uniform or breed uniform.
- The committee reserves the right to amend classes depending on entries received.
- Nose Clips must be used whenever the animal is being moved (i.e., loading on and off the truck, to and from the wash bay etc.)
- For the safety of participants protective footwear and clothing is to be worn (i.e., gumboots or boots and wet and dry weather clothes)
- Public Liability Insurance is the responsibility of the owner/exhibitor.
- Individual entries must have registered by 5.00pm Wednesday afternoon.
- All handlers who are staying on the grounds overnight must sign the register at the beef cattle committee office before 4pm each day. Junior handlers must be signed in by an adult.
- All handlers are to make sure that they are familiar with show etiquette relating to time allocation on wash, use of tie-ups and movement around the shed and the show ring.
